

Our Olympians of the science world

ONLY the best and brightest in high school science make it onto the Australian Science Olympiad team.

Remarkably, five students from James Ruse Agricultural High School have made it onto the 17-person squad.

Raymond Li, 17, Phillip Liang, 17, Wayne Wong, 17, Kim Zheng, 16, and Richard

Huang, 15, were chosen from a pool of more than 6000 high school students around the country to take part in a worldwide competition that pits the smartest biology, chemistry and physics students against each other.

Richard, Raymond and Phillip have just completed the chemistry leg of the Olympiad in Bratislava, Slovakia, and Prague,

Czech Republic, where they won two silver medals and a bronze medal.

"Everything they have achieved is an absolute feat," head science teacher Sheila Pooviah said.

"They are extremely motivated, very competitive and, more than anything, they are great human beings."

The next challenge will be the International Earth

Science Olympiad. Wayne and Kim will travel to Kanchanaburi in Thailand next week for the competition.

The five students make up the highest number of Olympians from any one school in Australia.

Australia's chief scientist Alan Finkel said the program "unlocked Australia's next generation of brilliant minds".

Agriculture Update

It's happening again down on JRAHS farm. The pitter patter of little hooves is echoing around the paddocks. Five of our ewes have given birth this term - 2 sets of twins, 1 of triplets and 2 single births.

All three of the triplets were of a very good size but their mother could just not cope with raising them all after she had carried them for the 5 month gestation period and refused to accept the little female lamb. This lamb was named Millie by our farmhand, Mark and the students have been helping to care and feed her. At night she has gone home with Mrs Ashhurst and Dr Zounis to keep up the intensive feeding regime of a baby. After a few weeks, her need for milk feeding will reduce as she becomes able to feed herself on grass and she will rejoin the school flock.

Over the last month, record prices for Prime Lamb keep being broken. Last week a 40kg lamb was sold for \$297 in Wagga Wagga. No one thought this could be beaten. Then this week, there was yet another record

set in Forbes where a lamb sold for \$300.60. These really are outstanding prices but sadly it is due to the shortage of supply due to the massive drought farmers are experiencing in NSW.

Not that our lambs will come up to these heady prices, but they certainly will have far more value than in previous years.

We have 9 lambs born to date and there are two more ewes yet to give birth. Fingers crossed for two more sets of twins.

Early Offers

Receive a guaranteed spot at the Universities of your choice *before* you get your ATAR/OP.

Embarking on a tertiary education can be a daunting process. You've got lots of decisions to make and lots on your plate, but an Early Offer from a university can help reduce the normal stresses of Year 12 and give you some space to breathe.

It's easy to apply for an early offer now, and depending on the university you apply to, you may be offered a guaranteed place before you've even started sitting your HSC exams. Sometimes there may be other conditions, as described by UAC -

"Such offers are generally conditional on other requirements being met, such as successful completion of a Senior Secondary Certificate of Education or achievement of a specified minimum ATAR."

But some will even offer you a secure spot based on the expectation that you "*maintain or exceed the level of academic performance indicated in your application and interview*" (from the University of Wollongong).

Am I eligible to apply?

Are you excelling in your studies or sports, or have been recognised for your volunteering efforts or other extra-curricular activities? Then you may well be eligible to apply.

If you're still unsure, have a chat with your teachers or principal to discuss whether they think you're able to apply and how they can help you complete your application.

What happens next?

Once you've decided that you are eligible to apply for an Early Offer and made up your mind that's what you'd like to do, (why wouldn't you if it could guarantee you a spot at Uni before your exams?), there's a few steps you need to take:

1. Go to your chosen University's website
2. Search for the Early Offer (or similar) section
3. Take note of the closing date and make sure you take action well in advance.
4. Follow the prompts. Download any forms, or fill in the online form, speak to your teachers if you need their input. Failing that, call the contact number and ask for help from the admissions department.

5. Submit the forms and any additional information required.
6. Keep up the good work at school and wait for an interview date or an email notifying you of your successful application and guaranteeing you a place at University.

2018 CoJR P&C TERM 3 FORUM MEETING RECAP

CoJR P&C works in close consultation with the School Executive months before the actual forum takes place to decide on the speaker and topic to be presented. This was especially the case when we invited the highly sought after and high profile **25th Vice Chancellor and Principal of University of Sydney, Dr Michael Spence**.

On **Tuesday July 31**, CoJR P&C were very honoured to have Dr Spence personally showcase how University of Sydney is "Reimagining the Undergraduate Experience" through their 2016-2020 Strategic Plan via 3 strategic themes of excellence, engagement and simplification.

Dr Spence is a lifelong educator and a lifelong learner - he is currently both an academic staff member and an undergraduate at USYD. In 2017 he was awarded the Companion of the Order of Australia (AC) to recognise his "eminent service to the higher education sector, to the advancement of equitable access to educational opportunities, to developing strategic programs focused on multidisciplinary research, and to the Anglican Church of Australia". He was also on the 2016 Macquarie Dictionary Word of the Year Panel which determined "fake news" as the winner.

USYD aims to develop their undergraduates to have the ability to be flexible, adapt, multitask, problem solve, think big picture and work in teams. It will be a global environment. Dr Spence who can speak 5 languages himself, (French, German, Mandarin, Italian and Korean although he did admit not all are fluent), encourages undergraduates to consider including a language in their university studies and in his thinking, participating in extracurricular activities is beneficial. Many jobs, such as social media managers and cloud architects/engineers that exist today did not exist 10 years ago, let alone 20 years ago, so undergraduates need to be prepared that their careers in the 21st century may not follow a traditional pathway.

Through USYD's new 4-year Bachelor of Advanced Studies degree, a student will be able to study 2 Major subjects, which can be totally unrelated, making it an exciting time for USYD to see the different combinations that will be possible. Dr Spence did comment the employment rate for 3-year graduate degree has decreased as employers now want to hire graduates with more life experience and this 4-year degree may now help fit the requirement. <https://sydney.edu.au/study/find-a-course/undergraduate-courses/bachelor-of-advanced-studies.html>
